INVESTIGATION INTO BREACHES

Request for investigation

36(1) Any person may request in writing that the Commissioner investigate an alleged breach of this Act by a member.

36(2) A request under subsection (1) shall be in the form of an affidavit and shall set out the grounds for the belief and the nature of the alleged breach.

36(3) The Assembly may, by resolution, request that the Commissioner investigate any matter respecting an alleged breach of this Act by a member.

36(4) Where a matter has been referred to the Commissioner under this section, neither the Assembly nor a committee of it shall inquire into the matter.

Investigation and inquiry

37(1) On receiving a request under section 36, the Commissioner may conduct an investigation with or without conducting an inquiry.

37(2) The Commissioner shall provide the member who is the subject of the investigation with reasonable notice and shall give the member an opportunity to respond to the allegation.

37(2.1) When the Commissioner conducts an investigation or an inquiry under this section, the member who is the subject of the request under section 36 shall respond promptly and completely to all of the Commissioner's questions and requests for information.

37(3) Where the Commissioner elects to conduct an inquiry under this section, the Commissioner has all the powers, privileges and immunities conferred on a commissioner under the *Inquiries Act*.

37(4) If the Commissioner is of the opinion that the request is frivolous, vexatious or not made in good faith, or that there are no grounds or insufficient grounds for an investigation, the Commissioner may refuse to conduct an investigation, or may cease the investigation.

37(5) If the Commissioner refuses to conduct an investigation or ceases an investigation, the Commissioner shall inform


(a) the member against whom the allegation was made, and

(b) the person who made the request or, if the request was made by the Assembly, the Speaker. 2003, c.8, s.5; 2007, c.30, s.24.

AFFIDAVIT

- I, Bruce Fitch of the City of Riverview in the Province of New Brunswick, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Riverview, MAKE OATH AND SAY AS FOLLOWS:
- 1. I am Bruce Fitch, Member of the Legislative Assembly for the Province of New Brunswick, and as such have personal knowledge of the matters deposed to except where otherwise stated to be based on information and belief.
- 2. Richard Miles is a Member of the Legislative Assembly for the Province of New Brunswick and was appointed to the Executive Council as Minister of Environment and Member of the Cabinet Committee Board of Management on July 24, 2009.
- 3. Brian Miles is the father of Environment Minister Richard Miles and is the owner of Elmtree Environmental Ltd.
- 4. Elmtree Environmental Ltd is a company specializing in Soil Remediation, Waste Management, Demolition and Project Management. The physical location of Elmtree Environmental Ltd. is 349 King St Post Box 444 Fredericton, NB, E3B1E4.
- 5. In 1994 Elmtree Environmental started a long term lease arrangement with the Fredericton Region Solid Waste Commission.
- 6. Problems between Elmtree Environmental and the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission caused a legal dispute between the parties to initiate in or about April of 2008.
- 7. I believe that Mr. Richard Miles, Minister of Environment, has a personal familiar interest in Elmtree Environmental Ltd. and therefore his appointment to the Minister of the Environment put him in an immediate conflict of interest which he should have recognized and taken appropriate steps to removed himself from dealings and decision making responsibilities with respect to the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission.

- 8. Instead of removing himself from all dealings between Elmtree Ltd and the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission Richard Miles appointed Lorrie Yerxa to the board of the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission.
- 7. Lorrie Yerxa is a Lawyer in Fredericton who was appointed to the board of the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission on October 14, 2009, by Environment Minister Richard Miles.
- 8. On January 28, 2010 I believe that Lorrie Yerxa quit the board due a conflict of interest between his business relationships with Brian Miles and his role as a board Member of the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission.
- 9. I hand delivered a letter from the Law Office of David L. Peterson on February 3rd 2010 for Justice Ryan to consider in regards to the conflict of interest problem.
- 10. Litigation between Elmtree Environmental Ltd. and The Fredericton Solid Waste Commission was initiated before the appointment of Richard Miles. Because of this Richard Miles knew or ought to have known that his family relationship put him in a conflict of interest when dealing with the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission.
- 11. Also I believe that the Richard Miles as the Minister of Environment failed to recognize that by continuing to make decisions and appointments to the Fredericton Solid Waste Commission in October of 2009 it put him further in a conflict of interest especially since the business relationships between Brian Miles and Lorrie Yerxa lead to Mr. Yerxa resigning from his board appointment.
- 12. I believe that the decisions of Richard Miles after he was appointed Minister of the Environment must be investigated in order to find out how these actual and perceived conflict of interest issues were not caught by the safe guards in place.
- 13. I make this Affidavit for an investigation under section 36 of the Members Conflict of Interest Act.

Dear Mr. Premier:

Please be advised that I represent the Fredericton Region Solid Waste Commission. The Commission is currently involved in significant litigation wherein Elmtree Environmental Ltd. is the plaintiff. Reference to the Corporate Affairs Registry Database shows Mr. Brian D. Miles as a director of Elmtree Environmental Ltd. and it is clear from communications the Commission has undertaken with the company, Mr. Miles is in full control of Elmtree Environmental Ltd.

As you are no doubt aware, the Honourable Rick Miles, your Minister of Environment is the son of Brian D. Miles.

On January 19, 2010 at the regular monthly meeting of the Commission two motions were passed unanimously by the members of the Commission related to the appointments made by your Minister of Environment pursuant to section 15.4(1)(b) of the Clean Environment Act.

Motion #1 reads as follows

"MOTION #1

Whereas the Commission is currently involved in litigation with Elmtree Environmental Ltd., owned and operated by Mr. Brian Miles.

And whereas issues and concerns have arisen regarding a possible undeclared conflict of interest by Mr. Lorrie Yerxa (a newly appointed Member of the Commission) in relation to his past service as legal council for Mr. Brian Miles (owner of Elmtree Environmental Ltd.), and in regards to Mr. Yerxa's son's employment with Elmtree Environmental Ltd., and further with Mr. Yerxa (after Informing the Board members that he is a lawyer) providing a legal opinion on a correspondence between the General Manager of FRSWC, the Commissions lawyer and Elmtree Environmental Ltd.

It is moved that the Commission instruct its lawyer (David Peterson) to file a complaint:

- a. With the New Brunswick Law Society for determination on the issue of whether Mr. Lorrie Yerxa's actions since being appointed to the Commission are in violation of Chapter 17 of the Code of Professional Conduct and particularly whether he has been in a conflict of interest, without declaration of same.
- b. And with the Department of Local government (or appropriate body) for determination of any possible conflict of interest violations under the New Brunswick Municipalities Act and the Clean Environment Act."

The second motion instructed the Commission's lawyer to write this letter to bring to your attention the matter of recent appointments to the Commission by the Minister of Environment and to raise with you the potential conflict of interest that is evident in his making these appointments.

Motion #2 reads as follows:

"MOTION #2

Whereas the Commission is currently involved in litigation with Elmtree Environmental Ltd., owned and operated by Mr. Brian Miles.

And whereas the Minister of Environment (Hon. Rick Miles) is the son of Mr. Brian Miles, and whereas the Minister is responsible for appointing up to four members, as representatives for the Local Service Districts, to the FRSWC Board.

And whereas two recent appointments have raised serious questions within the Commission – one is concerning a possible undeclared conflict of interest, and another concerns a representative appointed for a Local Service District who resides within the City of Fredericton. Concerning the LSD representative who resides within the City of Fredericton, this Board received a correspondence from the Department of Local Government stating that this

appointment was not in keeping with the intention of the policy and that it would be revoked. Subsequently, the Minister of Environment (according to the LSD representative in question) stated he could appoint whomever he wanted regardless of where they live and that this appointment stands.

It is moved that the Commission instruct its lawyer (David Peterson) to forward a letter to Premier Shawn Graham raising the matter of appointments to the Commission by the Minister of Environment and whether there exists a conflict of interest in making such appointments, due to the familial relationship between the Minister (Hon. Rick Miles) and the owner of Elmtree Environmental Ltd. (Mr. Brian Miles) and whether there should be a review of the appointments by the Minister to this Commission's Board."

The Commission would ask that you review the Minister's appointments and satisfy yourself that the integrity of the appointment process was respected.

Upon reviewing the circumstances leading up to this point I believe you will appreciate that a reasonable apprehension of conflict of interest is obvious and that any further appointments to the FRSWC board to represent local service districts should be made by someone other than the Hon. Rick Miles.

Re: Predericton Region Solid Waste Commission

I am writing to acknowledge and respond to two matters raised in your letter of January 21, 2010.

Firstly, you have asked for a determination (including presumably an investigation) by the "appropriate body" of any possible conflict of interest violations under the Municipalities Act or the Clean Environment Act. While a regional solid waste commission is included within the definition of a "local board" for the purposes of sections 90.1 to 90.91 of the Municipalities Act, and while Mr. Yerxa was a member of a local board within those provisions, I would suggest that neither the Minister of the Environment nor the Minister of Local Government are in a position to determine in any formal way whether a conflict of interest exists.

In the Hoddinatt case (1983) 46 N.B.R. (2d) 340, Justice Stevenson wrote:

Section 2 of the Municipalities Act charges the Minister with the duty of administering the Act... I do not interpret a duty or responsibility of administering a statute or of directing and supervising administrative conduct as encompassing authority to ... render a decision as to the legality of something a council has done.

With respect, the same conclusion holds true with respect to the authority (or better, the lack thereof) of the Minister to render a decision as to the legality a member of a council or local board has done. Whatever the "appropriate body" is, I regret to advise that it is neither the Minister of the Environment nor the Minister of Local Government. Your complaint, if it is to be pursued, will have to be directed elsewhere.

Finally, while there is a Ministerial provision under sub section 15.4(9) of the Clean Environment Act to remove a member of a commission seemingly without cause, the issue of removal from office is now academic, as Mr. Yerka has resigned and the other LSD rep whose situation is addressed in your letter has indicated his intention to resign.

With respect to the second point raised in your letter, as you may now be aware from the considerable publicity surrounding these matters, the Honourable Rick Doucet, Minister of Fisheries, has been directed and authorized to discharge the responsibilities of the Minister of the Environment, Honourable Rick Miles, in relation to the Fredericton Ragion Solid Waste Commission (the "Commission"). This should resolve any conflict of interest concerns on the part of the commission or its officers.


You have asked that I review the Minister's appointments to the commission and satisfy myself that the integrity of the appointment process was respected. However, it is not my role to police the conflict of interest provisions under the Municipalities Act. That role belongs to the courts, and I have no authority to intervene or to pass judgment as to whether those provisions have been respected. As the courts have not pronounced on the propriety of either appointment in issue, I do not believe that it is for me to purport to usurp their role.

I trust this will suffice for your purposes.



AFFIDAVIT

I, RICHARD MILES, of the City of Fredericton, County of York and Province of New Brunswick, Minister of the Department of Environment ("DOE") and Member of the Legislative Assembly for the riding of Fredericton, Silverwood, MAKE OATH AND SAY AS FOLLOWS:

- I have personal knowledge of the maters herein deposed to except where stated on information and belief and in such case I do believe the information and belief to be verily true.
- 2. I have reviewed the Affidavit of Bruce Fitch, Member of the Legislative Assembly for the riding of Riverview ("Fitch") and I agree with paragraphs 2, 3, a portion of 4 and 5 of his Affidavit dated March 23, 2010 ("Fitch Affidavit").



- 3. I deny the allegations made in the first paragraph 7 and paragraph 11 of the Fitch Affidavit.
- 4. I have no knowledge of the allegations in paragraphs 6 of the Fitch Affidavit.
- 5. As to paragraph 4 of the Fitch Affidavit Elmtree Environmental Ltd's ("EEL") physical location is at 77 Timothy Avenue, Hanwell, NB E3C 2B7.
- 6. As to the first paragraph 8 of the Fitch Affidavit after a process which flows through the Minister of Local Government, Bernard LeBlanc, ("MLG") and finally to my office Lorrie Yerxa was appointed to the Fredericton Regional Solid Waste Commission ("FRSWC"). Attached hereto and marked "A" is the Procedure for Ministerial Appointments. (the "Procedure")
- 7. As to paragraph 7 of the Fitch Affidavit Lorrie Yerxa was appointed to the FRSWC pursuant to the Procedure.
- 8. As to the second paragraph 8 in the Fitch Affidavit I have been advised by my counsel, Allen Miles, that Lorrie Yerxa had no business relationships with Brian D. Miles nor was he his counsel and Lorrie Yerxa did not resign due to any relationship with Brian D. Miles.
- 9. As to paragraph 10 I was not aware of any litigation between EEL and FRSWC (the "Litigation") until I read the *Daily Gleaner* on or about January 8, 2010. Brian D. Miles has numerous businesses and I am not aware of his dealings and I have never been involved or made aware of any dealings of EEL.
- 10. As to paragraph 12 of the Fitch Affidavit I deny the portion that indicates any decisions made by me as Minister of the Environment were made to create an actual or a perceived Conflict of Interest.

- 11. As to the whole Fitch Affidavit and in particular the letter from the Law Office of David L. Peterson dated January 21, 2010 referred to in paragraph 9 of the Fitch Affidavit and attached hereto as Schedule "B", I state as follows:
 - a. The process of the appointment of Lorri Yerxa was governed by MLG and was not initiated by me;
 - b. I understand there was one other individual other than Lorrie Yerxa who was willing to be a FRSWC board member but the only person who was approved by MLG was Lorrie Yerxa therefore he was selected as he was the only name that was presented to me for authorization for that Local Service District ("LSD");
 - c. I was aware that Lorrie Yerxa's son was an employee of EEL but I understand that is not a conflict in this situation. I understood that his son did not reside with Lorrie Yerxa and the son has no interest in EEL other than he is a paid employee;
 - d. Brian D. Miles owns numerous companies and employs numerous people in various industries and I do not know the majority of his employees and I have never made any decisions or had any interest involving Brian D. Miles companies;
 - e. In my Member's Public Disclosure Statement and the update I provided upon being appointed as Minister of DOE a diagram of the Corporations owned by Brian D. Miles was provided as part of the disclosure and EEL was outlined in that diagram along with its connection to other corporations of Brian D. Miles;
 - f. There is a letter produced dated August 3, 2005 from Brian D. Miles, CEO of EEL to FRSWC, Attention: Gordon Wilson, General Manager and CEO which was sent on a Without Prejudice basis and copied to various people including Peter Mockler, EEL's solicitor in the Litigation, Allen Miles, Lorrie Yerxa, Darren Chamberlain an EEL employee and Daryl DeMerchant of Gemtec Limited, which letter is attached hereto and marked "C". I comment on that letter as follows:

- I have been advised by Allen Miles that he never received a copy of this letter until this Conflict of Interest matter was initiated and I retained him as counsel;
- ii. I have been advised by Allen Miles that through his investigation and meetings and discussions with Lorri Yerxa that Lorri Yerxa has never had any dealings as counsel, adviser, a business relationship or otherwise with EEL in its dealings with FRSWC or in particular any dealings with the Litigation;
- iii. I have been advised by Allen Miles that through his investigations and discussions and meetings with Brian D. Miles that at the time this letter was created Brian D. Miles was contemplating litigation against the FRSWC by EEL but never discussed this issue with Lorrie Yerxa and selected Peter Mocker as a result of any ongoing Provincial Sales Tax dispute that another Brian D. Miles company had against the Province of New Brunswick;
- iv. Allen Miles is a cousin to my father and I and has been my counsel since I began needing legal services for purchasing and building homes and also dealing with corporations I owned;
- v. Allen Miles has been counsel to Brian D. Miles and his corporations for in excess of 19 years and I had no knowledge that Lorrie Yerxa had ever provided legal services to Brian D. Miles or his corporations and the only other counsel I was aware of was Peter Mocker who had handled the Province of New Brunswick sales tax case;
- vi. I have been advised by Allen Miles that he has always been counsel for EEL, except for Peter Mockler's involvement with the Litigation and he incorporated EEL and was counsel for EEL when it entered into the lease with FRSWC on November 1, 1994 being the date of the lease;

- vii. I had no knowledge of this letter and I first saw the letter when it was produced by the FRSWC through David L.E. Peterson as a result of this matter;
- g. The only first time member of the FRSWC I was involved with was Lorrie Yerxa but I did reappoint Phillip E. Jensen, Pierre Theriault and H. E. Hartley as members of the board which was effective November 1, 2009 and the reappointment Procedure of these members is outlined in attachment "A" and MLG controls the process;
- h. In the January 21, 2010 letter to Premier Shawn Graham from David L. E. Peterson, attachment "B", an issue is raised about two appointments to the FRSWC one of which is Lorrie Yerxa and the other is about a board member who does not reside in the LSD he represents, which is Phillip E. Jensen whose district is St. Mary's North of Nashwaak Village. I comment on this issue as follows:
 - i. The reappointment of Phillip E. Jensen was approved by MLG and subsequently approved by me prior to an email being issued by a policy analyst with the Department of Local Government dated October 30, 2009;
 - ii. The issue was discussed at a meeting of the board members on November 17, 2009 and a Motion was approved to forward my office a letter requesting a retraction of the email to allow Phillip E. Jensen to continue as a board member and subsequent to that Motion Phillip E. Jensen was unanimously elected as Chairperson of the Board;
 - iii. Subsequent to Phillip E. Jensen being appointed Chairperson the issue was raised by Fitch and/or David L. E. Peterson in the January 21, 2010 letter

where it is stated in Motion # 2 that I said "I could appoint whomever I wanted regardless of where they live and that this appointment stands.";

- iv. There is no dated associated with this statement I allegedly made and I deny ever making this statement as the MLG is in control of the process of appointments and until an approval arrives at my desk I have no control;
- v. After the issue arose and Phillip E. Jensen was made Chairperson of the Board it was my position that he remain as a member and the Chairperson until the matter could be resolved or another person is appointed through the process;
- vi. Subsequent to this issue arising but prior to the January 21, 2010 letter from David L. E. Peterson, Phillip E. Jensen became a property owner in the LSD which raised other questions about his ability to represent the LSD;
- vii. After the letter of January 21, 2010 and the issues with FRSWC, Phillip E. Jensen resigned from the Board at his own accord, not at the request of me or a department of the Province of New Brunswick.
- i. In early January of 2010 after learning of the possible existence of a conflict of interest, a potential conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest related to being a member of the Executive Council and Minister of the Department of Environment and dealing with FRSWC, I requested Premier Shawn Graham or the Executive Council by letter dated January 8, 2010 to designate another Minister to act in place of me in relation to any files dealing with the FRSWC. Attached hereto and marked "D" is this letter.

- j. Immediately upon my learning of a conflict of interest, a potential conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest related to the FRSWC I attended with the Conflict of Interest Commission prior to the letter sent to Premier Shawn Graham attached and marked "D".
- k. A reply from Premier Shawn Graham dated January 8, 2010 is attached hereto and marked "E" whereby he appointed another Minister, namely the Honourable Rick Doucet, Minister of Fisheries subject to a review by the Conflict of Interest Commissioner and the requirements of the Executive Council Act, SNB
- 1. Premier Shawn Graham replied to the January 21, 2010 letter of David L. E. Peterson by letter dated February 2, 2010 attached hereto and marked "F".
- m. On or about January 27, 2010 Lorrie Yerxa tendered his resignation as a board member of the FRSWC and I have been advised by Allen Miles that in this discussion with Lorrie Yerxa the reason he resigned was not that he was in a Conflict of Interest situation concerning Brian D. Miles or his corporations but because he had more than enough work in his law practice, he did not need to deal with false accusations and the circumstances that were part of the politics in the matter of him being a board member of the FRSWC, and that he felt he could not represent his LSD property given the restrictions on him as a Board Member.
- n. Although I do not admit that I was aware of any conflict of interest I felt it was necessary and prudent to remove myself from any dealings with the FRSWC once the matter came to my attention.
- 12. I made no appointment or decision that would have affected the litigation dealing with FRSWC, Gordon Wilson and John Bigger, Court File Number F/C/127/08.

- 13. I have been advised by Allen Miles that the Litigation has only proceeded to an exchange of documents and no discovery but a Motion has been heard and an injunction is in place to allow EEL to continue to operate at FRSWC.
- 14. I make this Affidavit in Reply to the request of Fitch for an investigation under Section 36 and my reply is pursuant to Section 37(2) and 2.1 of the Members' Conflict of Interest Act, RSNB, Ch M-7.01.

Procedure for Ministerial Appointments

Regional Solid Waste Commissions & District Planning Commissions

Responsibility

Recommendations for appointment to regional solid waste commissions (SWC) and district planning commissions (DPC) are made to the Minister of Environment by the Minister of Local Government as the Minister is responsible for the unincorporated areas in the Province. The Minister of Environment appoints four members to each of the 12 SWCs and one to several members to each of the 12 DPCs (as defined by each Ministerial Order under the Community Planning Act which establishes the DPC). The Policy and Strategic Initiatives Division coordinates the process for Ministerial appointments to DPCs and SWCs (following the steps outlined in the attached Process flow chart). This includes verifying the eligibility of a candidate for appointment or reappointment.

Candidates

Names of potential candidates for appointment come from a variety of sources, including Local Services Manager (LSMs), MLAs, local service district advisory committees and individuals. These names are forwarded to the office of the Minister of Local Government for consideration. LSMs are periodically advised of any existing or upcoming vacancies for the commissions within their region and routinely recommend candidates that they believe would be suitable for appointment. Potential members commonly recommended by LSMs are primarily local service district advisory committee members.

Consultation

The suitability of candidates is determined in consultation with LSMs, and in some instances with the Department of Environment. In the case of reappointments, the commission may be consulted to determine the incumbent's past attendance and participation in the activities of the commission. Staff of the Department of Local Government receive the name of a recommended candidate for appointment/reappointment and the following steps are taken:

confirm that candidate is not a civil servant (recommendation of the Office of Human

Resources):

determine the number of terms served (SWC reappointments);

consider commission area requirements (where possible, attempts are made to distribute members across the region covered by each SWC or DPC);

confirm that the candidate resides in an LSD within the SWC/DPC region; and

advise regional departmental staff of potential appointment.

Approval Process

Appointments are made to fill vacancies on an SWC or DPC or to reappoint existing members whose terms have expired. A member of an SWC may be reappointed but may not serve more than three consecutive, three-year terms. A member of a DPC may also be reappointed but there is no limit on the number of terms a member of a DPC may serve. The attached figure presents the procedure to follow once a vacancy or potential vacancy (in the case of expiring appointments) is identified for an SWC or DPC. Once a candidate has been identified, their eligibility for appointment is confirmed by departmental staff consulting as necessary. Following this, if the name did not originate from the Minister's office, the name is forwarded to


the Minister's office for consideration. Once a name has been vetted, a letter is drafted for signature by the Minister of Local Government welcoming the commission member and instructing that they confirm acceptance of the appointment with their (LSM). Simultaneously, a request is sent to the appointments coordinator of the Department of Environment for an appointment letter to be drafted for consideration by the Minister of Environment. Subsequently, the signed letters are copied and mailed by the Policy and Strategic Initiatives Division.

Tracking Lists and Updates

A list of appointments to district planning commissions and solid waste commissions is maintained by the Policy and Strategic Initiatives Division. This list contains various details such as a summary of all of the appointments made by the Minister and the date terms expire. Existing and upcoming vacancies are highlighted for the attention of the Minister's office. An updated list is provided monthly to the DLG and DENV Ministers' offices and the Deputy Minister.

issue

The responsibility for land use planning and district planning commissions currently rests with the Department of Environment.

Background

The Town Planning Act was established in New Brunswick in 1912. It was subsequently rolled into a new Act - the Community Planning Act in 1960-61, and was consolidated in 1972. Until the formation of DELG, the legislation was always under the purview of the department responsible for local governments. Only when DLG and Environment were split in February 2006 was the responsibility transferred to a department other than the one responsible for local governments.

A March 2005 study conducted by the Québec Ministry of Municipal Affairs concluded that the community planning function, as well as the responsibility for local government institutions were the only two functions that were common in the administrative structures of the 10 provincial departments responsible for Municipal Affairs in Canada. Consequently, the current configuration in New Brunswick where responsibility for community planning resides in a department other than municipal affairs is currently the exception across Canada.



Please be advised that I represent the Fredericton Region Solid Waste Commission. The Commission is currently involved in significant litigation wherein Elmtree Environmental Ltd. is the plaintiff. Reference to the Corporate Affairs Registry Database shows Mr. Brian D. Miles as a director of Elmtree Environmental Ltd. and it is clear from communications the Commission has undertaken with the company, Mr. Miles is in full control of Elmtree Environmental Ltd.

As you are no doubt aware, the Honourable Rick Miles, your Minister of Environment is the son of Brian D. Miles.

On January 19, 2010 at the regular monthly meeting of the Commission two motions were passed unanimously by the members of the Commission related to the appointments made by your Minister of Environment pursuant to section 15.4(1)(b) of the Clean Environment Act.

Motion #1 reads as follows

"MOTION #1

Whereas the Commission is currently involved in litigation with Elmtree Environmental Ltd., owned and operated by Mr. Brian Miles.

And whereas issues and concerns have arisen regarding a possible undeclared conflict of interest by Mr. Lorrie Yerxa (a newly appointed Member of the Commission) in relation to his past service as legal council for Mr. Brian Miles (owner of Elmtree Environmental Ltd.), and in regards to Mr. Yerxa's son's employment with Elmtree Environmental Ltd., and further with Mr. Yerxa (after informing the Board members that he is a lawyer) providing a legal opinion on a correspondence between the General Manager of FRSWC, the Commissions lawyer and Elmtree Environmental Ltd.

It is moved that the Commission instruct its lawyer (David Peterson) to file a complaint:

- a. With the New Brunswick Law Society for determination on the issue of whether Mr. Lorrie Yerxa's actions since being appointed to the Commission are in violation of Chapter 17 of the Code of Professional Conduct and particularly whether he has been in a conflict of interest, without declaration of same.
- b. And with the Department of Local government (or appropriate body) for determination of any possible conflict of interest violations under the New Brunswick Municipalities Act and the Clean Environment Act."

The second motion instructed the Commission's lawyer to write this letter to bring to your attention the matter of recent appointments to the Commission by the Minister of Environment and to raise with you the potential conflict of interest that is evident in his making these appointments.

Motion #2 reads as follows:

"MOTION #2

Whereas the Commission is currently involved in litigation with Elmtree Environmental Ltd., owned and operated by Mr. Brian Miles,

And whereas the Minister of Environment (Hon. Rick Miles) is the son of Mr. Brian Miles, and whereas the Minister is responsible for appointing up to four members, as representatives for the Local Service Districts, to the FRSWC Board.

And whereas two recent appointments have raised serious questions within the Commission — one is concerning a possible undeclared conflict of interest, and another concerns a representative appointed for a Local Service District who resides within the City of Fredericton. Concerning the LSD representative who resides within the City of Fredericton, this Board received a correspondence from the Department of Local Government stating that this

appointment was not in keeping with the intention of the policy and that it would be revoked. Subsequently, the Minister of Environment (according to the LSD representative in question) stated he could appoint whomever he wanted regardless of where they live and that this appointment stands.

It is moved that the Commission instruct its lawyer (David Peterson) to forward a letter to Premier Shawn Graham raising the matter of appointments to the Commission by the Minister of Environment and whether there exists a conflict of interest in making such appointments, due to the familial relationship between the Minister (Hon. Rick Miles) and the owner of Elmtree Environmental Ltd. (Mr. Brian Miles) and whether there should be a review of the appointments by the Minister to this Commission's Board."

The Commission would ask that you review the Minister's appointments and satisfy yourself that the integrity of the appointment process was respected.

Upon reviewing the circumstances leading up to this point I believe you will appreciate that a reasonable apprehension of conflict of interest is obvious and that any further appointments to the FRSWC board to represent local service districts should be made by someone other than the Hon. Rick Miles.

I am writing to acknowledge and respond to two matters raised in your letter of January 21, 2010.

Firstly, you have asked for a determination (including presumably an investigation) by the "appropriate body" of any possible conflict of interest violations under the *Municipalities Act* or the *Clean Environment Act*. While a regional solid waste commission is included within the definition of a "local board" for the purposes of sections 90.1 to 90.91 of the *Municipalities Act*, and while Mr. Yerxa was a member of a local board within those provisions, I would suggest that neither the Minister of the Environment nor the Minister of Local Government are in a position to determine in any formal way whether a conflict of interest exists.

In the Hoddinnott case (1983) 46 N.B.R. (2d) 340, Justice Stevenson wrote:

Section 2 of the Municipalities Act charges the Minister with the duty of administering the Act...

I do not interpret a duty or responsibility of administering a statute or of directing and supervising administrative conduct as encompassing authority to ... render a decision as to the legality of something a council has done.

With respect, the same conclusion holds true with respect to the authority (or better, the lack thereof) of the Minister to render a decision as to the legality a member of a council or local board has done. Whatever the "appropriate body" is, I regret to advise that it is neither the Minister of the Environment nor the Minister of Local Government. Your complaint, if it is to be pursued, will have to be directed elsewhere.

Finally, while there is a Ministerial provision under sub section 15.4(9) of the Clean Environment Act to remove a member of a commission seemingly without cause, the issue of removal from office is now academic, as Mr. Yerxa has resigned and the other LSD rep whose situation is addressed in your letter has indicated his intention to resign.

With respect to the second point raised in your letter, as you may now be aware from the considerable publicity surrounding these matters, the Honourable Rick Doucet, Minister of Fisheries, has been directed and authorized to discharge the responsibilities of the Minister of the Environment, Honourable Rick Miles, in relation to the Fredericton Region Solid Waste Commission (the "Commission"). This should resolve any conflict of interest concerns on the part of the commission or its officers.

You have asked that I review the Minister's appointments to the commission and satisfy myself that the integrity of the appointment process was respected. However, it is not my role to police the conflict of interest provisions under the *Municipalities Act*. That role belongs to the courts, and I have no authority to intervene or to pass judgment as to whether those provisions have been respected. As the courts have not pronounced on the propriety of either appointment in issue, I do not believe that it is for me to purport to usurp their role.

I trust this will suffice for your purposes.
